We recently sent out a letter regarding our school values and behaviour expectations. We appreciate your support in reinforcing these values at home. Additionally, we are working on an Anti-Bullying and Harassment Procedure to ensure a safe and respectful environment for all students.

Road Safety Reminder

We would like to remind all parents and guardians of the importance of adhering to the signed road rules both around and on school property. Ensuring the safety of our students is a top priority, and your cooperation is essential. Over the past two weeks we have had a number of phone calls from parents and caregivers relating to parents who are parking in No Standing or No Parking zones which is impacting the flow of traffic during busy periods.

We are also reviewing the signage for the Church carpark. Remember, this is a **ONE-WAY** area, so please turn left as you enter the carpark – this too will ensure the carpark flows and also makes this a safer area for students as they are walking to and from school.

Please note that the front carpark (off Victoria Road) is reserved for **staff and deliveries only.** The gate will be closed from 8:30 AM to 3:45 PM for student safety.

Building Works Update

Our building works are progressing well. The courts are coming along nicely, and we are in the process of obtaining permission to move the OSHC (Out of School Hours Care) into St Francis Hall. The roofing project is also progressing well, with a focus now moving over the pre-school area.

OSHC Access Changes

The OSHC service will soon be relocating to the St Francis Hall. When this occurs, all children being dropped off or picked up from the OSHC service will need to use the Railway Terrace Carpark – this will result in a smooth transition to the service across the courts and

into the Western Door. Sue will notify families when this comes into full effect.

Shrove Tuesday

Good old PANCAKE Day is almost upon us. Are you able to assist, help cook, serve, tidy up? If you are a dab hand at BBQing, flipping pancakes and serving them to our community, then please get in touch, I would love to hear from you.

Every year we celebrate Shrove Tuesday, or as you may know it...Pancake Day! But what is the meaning behind this special day? How and why is it celebrated?

The tradition of making pancakes on Shrove Tuesday comes from families using up all ingredients in their cupboards so that they can start Lent the next day (Ash Wednesday). The ingredients - eggs, flour and milk - used to be very common things for Christians to give up for Lent. These days it's probably the toppings that we're likely to give up - such as chocolate, sugary toppings, ice-cream and or sweets!

Lent is a period of 40 days where Christians remember the events leading up to and including the death of Jesus Christ. Christians use Lent as a way of testing their willpower - often giving up things like chocolate, other sweet treats, spending money, eating carbs, etc, before Easter. Many around the world, do this as a sign of sacrifice, just as Jesus Christ did when he went into the desert to pray and fast for the 40 days then later dying on the cross for us.

A very exciting time awaits us as we venture into Lent (Week 6), then Easter.

Project Compassion


Each year, throughout Term 1, we raise funds for Project Compassion. The funds raised help Project Compassion continue their charity work around the world helping those who are less fortunate than us.

NAPLAN YEARS 3 and 5

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9 and is the only nationwide assessment that all Australian children undertake.

Students will complete a national coordinated practice test on Tuesday, 27 February, in preparation for the testing window that begins on Wednesday, 13 March.

Maths in Year 1

The Year Ones have been busy in Maths lessons exploring number and shape. We have been using a range of manipulatives to create patterns and shape pictures. We have been exploring the properties of shapes and sorting and classifying them. We have created patterns using different materials. We really enjoy hands on experiences in Maths as well as consolidating all our learning during our Daily Reviews which include counting backwards and forwards, subitising and recognising and writing numerals and their names.



STEM Incursion

This week our year 5s and 6s participated in the ReWild Your School Incursion, where a local ecologist taught us about wildlife and their habitats on the peninsula. They created bee hotels for Blue Banded Bees using clay and hollows made of tubes for Microbats. If you look closely, you might see some new habitats around our school. Our goal is to attract more native wildlife to the area and create more biodiversity.
