End of Year Testing and Data Collection

Currently, our learners across all cohorts are undertaking diagnostic assessments in DIBELS (phonics/reading), PAT R (reading) and PAT M (numeracy). This is part of our ongoing commitment to track student progress, development and growth. These results will be analysed by our classroom teachers and leadership, at an individual, class and whole school level to ascertain areas that show strengths and areas that require an increased focus for 2025. Our DIBELS data will be used to inform intervention supports required for 2025.

Student wellbeing is also collected each term (Check In Pulse Survey), and it is important to remember that academic success and student wellbeing are closely linked, with each influencing and reinforcing the other. Elements such as self-esteem, persistence, motivation, resilience and a growth mindset all contribute to students' positive wellbeing and experiences at school. We are encouraged that this will be a priority in 2025 as we continue with our whole school commitment to PBIS (Positive Behaviour Intervention Supports).

Spirit of Christmas

Charity is at the heart of our Catholic identity. Catholic Charities is our umbrella organisation that supports the following agencies working with the most vulnerable in South Australia.

The agencies supported by Catholic Charities are:

- Hutt St Centre
- · Aboriginal Catholic Ministry
- Our Lady of La Vang & St Patrick's Special Schools
- · Centacare Catholic Family Services.

The Catholic Charities Appeal was founded in 1941 by Archbishop Beovich to help people in our community. Originally the Appeal was established to support the four orphanages in the Adelaide Diocese:

- The Orphanage of St Vincent de Paul
- St Joseph's Orphanage Largs Bay
- The industrial Home for Boys at Brooklyn Park
- The Foundling Home for infants in association with the Refuge at Wattle Street, Fullarton.

As social circumstances changed, the large orphanages were closed and children were cared for in family-type homes. This led to an increase in the number of Catholic welfare agencies providing for the different needs of children and families.

Christmas can be a time of joy for many people because it's a celebration of love, sharing, and togetherness. The holiday can have different meanings for different people, but its core message is one of hope, joy, and love. Together we can contribute to another's hope, joy and love.

Sacramental Program 2025

A sacramental program is a parish-led program that helps children prepare for sacraments and become members of the Catholic Church. The program is family-centred and supported by the APRIMs from Catholic schools. The sacraments that children typically prepare for are Confirmation, Reconciliation, and First Eucharist (Holy Communion). The sacraments help children grow into the Catholic church community and feel a sense of belonging to the Family of God.

An Education Support Officer (ESO) provides administration and classroom support within our school and in VERY brief, provides curriculum support for teaching staff by:

- · contributing to the planning and delivery of curriculum with participating teachers
- · delivering curriculum to children in small groups or to individuals under the direction of the teacher
- · performing administrative duties and records management
- organising and preparing materials and resources for activities, and organising activities within the safety guidelines under the direction of the teacher
- · discussing program implementation and evaluation with the teacher
- helping organise special events and children's work displays.
